New Business Registrations this month




As of December 2023, Rotorua District saw 34.0 new business registrations, a decrease of 20.93% compared with September 2023.



Rental affordability (% of income spent on rent)



As of December 2023, residents of Rotorua District spent 29.9% of their household income on rent, an increase of 0.67% compared with September 2023.

As of September 2023, an average of \$115.0 was spent by individuals over 18 years in Rotorua District through electronic gaming machines, a decrease of 3.53% compared with June





In December 2023, Rotorua District had a crime rate of 15.5 incidents per 10,000 people, an increase of 1.43% compared with September 2023.

As of December 2023, the deprivation within Rotorua District is 9.0 and this is unchanged since November 2023.

In December 2023, 10.5% of the working population (15-64 years) in Rotorua District claimed Job Seeker Support, an increase of 1.66% compared with December 2022.

#### Total number of businesses registered to date






#### Distribution of registered businesses by industry

Rental, Hiring and Real Estate Services is the largest industry operating in Rotorua District and makes up 15.2% of all currently registered businesses.



Comparing December 2023 with December 2022 Rotorua District has seen a decrease in the number of new business registrations of 5.6% and a decrease in the number of business deregistrations of 30.8%.





#### Tourism spend this quarter

Domestic tourism International tourism



In July 2023, \$34.8M was spent in Rotorua District from domestic and international visitors to the district. Domestic tourism made up 80.2% of total tourism spend, and has decreased by 2.69% since the same time last year, whereas international tourism has increased by 59.14% in the same time period.

This quarter, the largest spend from international tourists visiting Rotorua District came from United States of America, with tourists spending \$5.3M. This represents an increase of \$3.7M since the same quarter last year.

This quarter, the largest spend from domestic tourists visiting Rotorua District came from the Auckland region, with tourists spending \$20M. This represents a decrease of \$88K since the same quarter last year.



This quarter, Rotorua District saw the greatest % change in domestic tourism spend from those visiting from the Marlborough region since the same quarter last year, with a \$65K decrease in spend.

Domestic tourism spend is calculated using the monthly spend of ina person electronic card transactions in the district, which come from individuals living outside of the district and whose own home district's largest urban centre is at least 40km away.

Note that our source of tourism spend data has been deprecated and no longer updating. DOT are seeking an alternative replacement.



In Rotorua District tourists spent the most on Retail sales - other this quarter, which was 20.4% of all tourism spend. This is 24.2% smaller than the national proportion.






Is the estimated total population in Rotorua District in 2023. The population in the area has increased by 1.66% or 1279 people since 2022.



#### **Population distribution**






As of March 2018 the largest ethnic group in Rotorua District is European (61.1%), 9.6% less than the national percentage. The ethnicity that has had the greatest change since March 2013 is Asian, increasing by 65.94%. In June 2023, Arahiwi saw the greatest change in population, with an increase of 6.7% since June 2022.

#### National Rotorua District




As of June 2023 the largest age band in Rotorua District is 10-14 (7.8%), 18% larger than the national distribution. The age band that has had the greatest change since June 2022 is 35-39, increasing by 6.36%.




Sole parent supportDec 2023rate





#### Median Household Income over time



As of December 2023, the median household income (adjusted for inflation) in Rotorua District was \$85,765. This is 13.7% less than the national median.

Within Rotorua District, the benefit rate by ethnicity with the greatest increase in the last 12 months was Single Parent Support for Pacific Peoples, up 7.47% to a value of 5.86 claimants per 100 working adults (15-64yrs). Comparatively, Single Parent Support for Other ethnicities (Asian, MELAA and other) saw the greatest decrease over the last 12 months, down 28.18% to 0.46 claimants per 100 working adults.



Ethnicity with greatest Jan 2022 change in secondary school retention





Asian European Māori MELAA Pacific Peoples

In 2022, Asian students in Rotorua District had the greatest proportion of students leaving with NCEA3. This is 2.12 times larger than Māori students, who have the lowest proportion of students leaving with NCEA Level 3. Pacific Peoples students have seen the greatest change in NCEA Level 3 pass rates, with an increase of 20.2%. Māori NCEA Level 3 pass rates in Rotorua District are 108% of National Māori rates.


#### School leavers with NCEA3 level by gender

#### Schools with greatest change in NCEA3 pass rate

In 2022, the school with the greatest change in the percentage of students leaving with NCEA Level 3 (pass rate) since 2021 was Rotorua Lakes High School, with a 15.99% decrease. Note that the table includes only those schools with more than 50 students.

Since 2014, on average the percentage of students leaving with NCEA Level 3 in Rotorua District for female students has been 1.18 times larger than male students. In 2022, the percentage of students leaving with NCEA Level 3 for female students compared with male students was less than average Compared to national figures, in 2022 the pass rate in Rotorua District were lower for both females and males.



#### Secondary school retention by ethnicity



In 2022, Asian students in Rotorua District had the greatest retention rate. This is 1.49 times larger than Māori students, who have the lowest retention rate. Asian students have seen the greatest change in retention, with an increase of 6.3%. Māori retention rates in Rotorua District are 92% of National Māori rates.




On average, since 2014, the retention rate in Rotorua District of female students has been 1.07 times larger than male students. In 2022, the retention rates of female students compared with male students was higher than average. Compared to national figures, in 2022 the retention rates in Rotorua District were lower for both females and males.

#### Schools with greatest change in retention


In 2022, the school with the greatest change in retention rate since 2021 was Rotorua Lakes High School, with a 16.28% decrease. Note that the table includes only those schools with more than 50 students.

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
Community with greatest increase in deprivation score






The community with the greatest change in deprivation score since the same time last year was Arahiwi, with a 8.2% decrease.


#### **Benefit Deprivation Indicators**





In Rotorua District, 65.9% of the population live in highly deprived communities (deprivation index 8-10), whereas 9.8% live in high socio-economic performing communities (deprivation index 1-3).






Community with greatest change in crime rate

#### **Comparison to National Crime Rate**






#### Crime Types with the Greatest Change

Within Rotorua District, the most prevalent type of crime in December 2023 was 'Theft From Retail Premises. The type of crime that had the greatest change in the last 3 months was 'Motor Vehicle Theft and Related Offences', with an increase of 8.4%.

#### Three months prior December 2023



In Rotorua District, communities with a deprivation index of 1 have the highest crime rate. The crime rate in these communities is 1.3 times higher than those with a deprivation index of 4, the group with the lowest crime rate. Communities with a deprivation index of 1 have seen the greatest change in their crime rate over the last 3 months, with an increase of -39.7%.

Arahiwi saw the greatest change in crime rate over the last 3 months in Rotorua District, with an increase of 37.3%.

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
