New Business Registrations this month




As of March 2024, Waikato District saw 53.0 new business registrations, an increase of 29.27% compared with December 2023.

As of March 2024, residents of Waikato District spent 24.1% of their household income on rent, an increase of 0.51% compared with December 2023.

As of September 2023, an average of \$41.0 was spent by individuals over 18 years in Waikato District through electronic gaming machines, a decrease of 0.43% compared with June






In March 2024, Waikato District had a crime rate of 34.2 incidents per 10,000 people, a decrease of 1.52% compared with December 2023.

#### Total number of businesses registered to date







#### Tourism spend this quarter

Domestic tourism International tourism



In July 2023, \$8.3M was spent in Waikato District from domestic and international visitors to the district. Domestic tourism made up 92% of total tourism spend, and has increased by 12.3% since the same time last year, whereas international tourism has increased by 46.87% in the same time period.

This quarter, the largest spend from international tourists visiting Waikato District came from Australia, with tourists spending \$591K. This represents an increase of \$23K since the same quarter last year.



Domestic tourism spend is calculated using the monthly spend of inperson electronic card transactions in the district, which come from individuals living outside of the district and whose own home district's largest urban centre is at least 40km away.

Note that our source of tourism spend data has been deprecated and no longer updating. DOT are seeking an alternative replacement.




In Waikato District tourists spent the most on Retail sales - fuel and other automotive products this quarter, which was 33.2% of all tourism spend. This is 181.4% larger than the national proportion.








Is the estimated total population in Waikato District in 2023. The population in the area has increased by 2.56% or 2250 people since 2022.



#### Population distribution









As of March 2018 the largest ethnic group in Waikato District is European (74.8%), 10.7% larger than the national percentage. The ethnicity that has had the greatest change since March 2013 is Asian, increasing by 67.06%. In June 2023, Pōkeno saw the greatest change in population, with an increase of 11.4% since June 2022.

As of June 2023 the largest age band in Waikato District is 10-14 (7.9%), 20.2% larger than the national distribution. The age band that has had the greatest change since June 2022 is 75-79, increasing by 8.1%.




Sole parent support Mar 2024 rate





National • Waikato District

As of March 2024, the median household income (adjusted for inflation) in Waikato District was \$114,328. This is 14.4% greater than the national median.

Within Waikato District, the benefit rate by ethnicity with the greatest increase in the last 12 months was Job Seeker Support for Pacific Peoples, up 34.68% to a value of 8.05 claimants per 100 working adults (15-64yrs). Comparatively, Single Parent Support for Other ethnicities (Asian, MELAA and other) saw the greatest decrease over the last 12 months, down 3.21% to 0.86 claimants per 100 working adults.

Ethnicity with greatest Jan 2022 change in secondary school retention





Asian European Māori HELAA Pacific Peoples

In 2022, MELAA students in Waikato District had the greatest proportion of students leaving with NCEA3. This is 3.66 times larger than Pacific Peoples students, who have the lowest proportion of students leaving with NCEA Level 3. Pacific Peoples students have seen the greatest change in NCEA Level 3 pass rates, with an increase of 18.9%. Māori NCEA Level 3 pass rates in Waikato District are 67% of National Māori rates.


#### Schools with greatest change in NCEA3 pass rate

In 2022, the school with the greatest change in the percentage of students leaving with NCEA Level 3 (pass rate) since 2021 was Huntly College, with a 14.16% decrease. Note that the table includes only those schools with more than 50 students.

Since 2014, on average the percentage of students leaving with NCEA Level 3 in Waikato District for female students has been 1.61 times larger than male students. In 2022, the percentage of students leaving with NCEA Level 3 for female students compared with male students was higher than average. Compared to national figures, in 2022 the pass rate in Waikato District were lower for both females and males.



#### Secondary school retention by ethnicity






In 2022, MELAA students in Waikato District had the greatest retention rate. This is 1.95 times larger than Māori students, who have the lowest retention rate. Pacific Peoples students have seen the greatest change in retention, with an increase of 60.6%. Māori retention rates in Waikato District are 69% of National Māori rates.

#### Secondary school retention by gender

Female Male



On average, since 2014, the retention rate in Waikato District of female students has been 1.23 times larger than male students. In 2022, the retention rates of female students compared with male students was higher than average.. Compared to national figures, in 2022 the retention rates in Waikato District were lower for both females and males.

#### Schools with greatest change in retention

In 2022, the school with the greatest change in retention rate since 2021 was Tuakau College, with a 17.56% decrease. Note that the table includes only those schools with more than 50 students.

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


Community with greatest increase in deprivation score

#### Distribution of Deprivation Index






The community with the greatest change in deprivation score since the same time last year was Horotiu, with a 4% increase.

#### **Benefit Deprivation Indicators**




In Waikato District, 24.3% of the population live in highly deprived communities (deprivation index 8-10), whereas 29.7% live in high socio-economic performing communities (deprivation index 1-3).





The benefit deprivation indicator that has changed the most in the last year is Job Seeker Support Rate (JSSR) which saw a 12.47% increase. The bars above represent Single Parent Support rate (SPSR), Means Tested Benefit rate (MTBR) and Job Seeker Support rate (JSSR).



Compared with the same time last year the crime rate in Waikato District has decreased by -3.6%, and is 34.3 as at March 2024. The crime rate is 31.9% below the national rate of 50.3.


#### Crime Types with the Greatest Change

Within Waikato District, the most prevalent type of crime in March 2024 was 'Unlawful Entry/Burglary/Breaking & Entering. The type of crime that had the greatest change in the last 3 months was 'Theft From Retail Premises', with an increase of 17.7%.

#### Three months prior March 2024



In Waikato District, communities with a deprivation index of 9 have the highest crime rate. The crime rate in these communities is 5.8 times higher than those with a deprivation index of 1, the group with the lowest crime rate. Communities with a deprivation index of 2 have seen the greatest change in their crime rate over the last 3 months, with an increase of 20.6%.
